GENERAL INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS

Classification and placement are the responsibility of the exhibitor. Clerks will be present to assist with classification and placement questions. Judging in Divisions I, II, and V will be according to rules, regulations, and guidelines of the American Rose Society. Please refer to pages 5 and 7. It is highly recommended that exhibitors call to reserve space for challenge classes in Division I Section 6. To reserve space leave a message with your name, telephone number, and planned class entry(ies) at 746-1140. A limited number of English-style boxes (Classes 25 & 29) and 6", 4.5" & 2.5" rose bowls (Classes 31-32) will be available during the show. If you wish to reserve any, please call 746-1140 and they will be placed on the show table with your reservation card. Your reserved space(s) will be indicated on the entry tables.

Note that only judges, clerks, and authorized Committee personnel will be permitted in the show area during judging.

DIVISION I
ARS ROSE HORTICULTURE SECTION
ARS RULES AND INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS

1. The Reno Rose Show will be governed by the standard rules, regulations, and guidelines of the **American Rose Society**. All judging in Division I will be done according to the rules and regulations of the American Rose Society and decisions of the judges shall be final.
2. All blooms from one garden must be exhibited under one name or one team only.
3. Show area will be open to entries from 8:00 to 10:30 am on June 13. Preparation area will open at 7:00 am. All entries must remain in place until 5:00 pm and should be removed at the close of show on June 13, 2009.
4. All entries must conform to the schedule or be disqualified. Entries in Section 4 with no date of introduction included on the entry tag will be disqualified. Specimens with a “stem-on-stem” condition will be disqualified unless they are properly classed and tagged shrub, old garden rose, or fragrance entries.
5. Entry tags for Division I entries will be furnished by the Reno Rose Society.
6. Containers will be provided, except in Classes 25, 29, 31 and 32. Only clear, uncolored containers (bowls) are permitted in Classes 31-32 of Division I. Containers will conform to “Classic Rose Bowl” or brandy snifter shapes. The use of colored water is prohibited.
7. Wedges, provided by the exhibitor, may be used, but must not protrude above the lip of the container.
8. To be eligible for entry, cultivar name must be recognized by the American Rose Society and must have been grown by the exhibitor outdoors for at least 45 days.
9. Classification of roses will be in accordance with the most recent entry in MODERN ROSES, Official List of Approved Exhibition Names, HANDBOOK FOR SELECTING ROSES, and new registrations published more than 30 days before the AMERICAN ROSE MAGAZINE or on the ARS website. Names in the Combined Rose List (Dobson and Schneider) as allowed by ARS guidelines are also permitted. Roses not exhibited under the accepted name will be disqualified.
10. This is an alphabetically arranged show in ALL classes. **Each variety shall constitute a separate class**, except where different varieties are required (*i.e.* 25[b] combination of varieties). Only one entry per class or subclass per exhibitor/team is allowed.
11. First, second, third, and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded as warranted, but judges may withhold any at their discretion. Trophies and certificates will be awarded only to specimens meriting first place (blue) ribbons.

12. Only persons who continue to be and have been members of the Reno Rose Society for at least a year prior to the show are eligible to receive any of the perpetual trophies. Perpetual trophies remain property of the Society. Annual awards may be awarded to persons ineligible to receive perpetual trophies.
13. The Reno Rose Society assumes no responsibility for loss, injury to persons, or damage to property.

DIVISION I — ENTRY CLASSES

SECTION 1 HYBRID TEAS, GRANDIFLORAS, AND THEIR CLIMBING COUNTERPARTS

Class 1 Hybrid Teas and Grandifloras, One bloom, no sidebuds (Singles not eligible)
All blue ribbon winners in Class 1 are eligible for Queen, King, and Princess of Show.

Class 2 Hybrid Tea, One Spray *A spray must have two or more blooms.* (Singles not eligible)

Class 3 Grandiflora, One Spray *A spray must have two or more blooms.* (Singles not eligible)

Class 4 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, One Bloom Fully Open
Stamens must be visible; no sidebuds. (Single blooms **must** be entered in Class 5)

Class 5 Single Hybrid Tea, One bloom or spray *Single blooms defined as having only 4-8 petals*

SECTION 2 FLORIBUNDAS AND POLYANTHAS

Class 6 Floribunda, One bloom, disbudded

Class 7 Floribunda, One spray *A spray must have two or more blooms*

Class 8 Polyantha, naturally grown

SECTION 3 LARGE FLOWERED CLIMBERS, HYBRID WICHURANAS, & HYBRID GIGANTEAS

May be shown as one bloom/spray with or without sidebuds
(Climbing Hybrid Teas & Grandifloras **must** be entered in Section 1)

Class 9 Large Flowered Climbers, Any variety

Class 10 Hybrid Wichuranas (Hwich) & Hybrid Giganteas (HG)

SECTION 4 SHRUBS AND OLD GARDEN ROSES

Class 11 Species introduced prior to 1867 or known to be prior to 1867 where date of introduction not established

Class 12 OGRs introduced prior to 1867, or known to be prior to 1867 where date of introduction not established (Alba, ayrshire, bourbon, boursault, centifolia, damask, hybrid bracteata, hybrid china, hybrid eglanteria, hybrid foetida, hybrid gallica, hybrid multiflora, hybrid perpetual, hybrid sempervirens, hybrid spinossissima, moss, noisette, portland, tea, etc.) Species not eligible for Dowager certificate.

Class 13 OGR introduced in or after 1867, or known to be after 1867 where date of introduction not established

Class 14 Classic Shrub — shrub with a family designation (hybrid bland, hybrid hugonis, hybrid laevigata, hybrid macounii, hybrid macrantha, hybrid moysesii, hybrid musk, hybrid nitida, hybrid nutkana, hybrid rugosa, hybrid suffulta, kordesii, etc.)

Class 15 Modern Shrub — shrub without a family connection; designated as shrub (S)

SECTION 5 MINIATURE AND MINI-FLORA ROSES

Class 16 Miniature One Bloom, no sidebuds (singles not eligible)
All blue ribbon miniature winners in Class 14 are eligible for Miniature Queen, King, and Princess

Class 17 Miniature One Spray *A spray must have two or more blooms*

Class 18 Miniature One Bloom Fully Open *Stamens must show (singles not eligible)*

Class 19 Single Miniature *One bloom per stem, disbudded Single bloom defined as having only 4-8 petals*

Class 20 Mini-Flora One Bloom, no sidebuds (singles not eligible)

Class 21 Mini-Flora One Spray *A spray must have two or more blooms*

Class 22 Mini-Flora One Bloom Fully Open *Stamens must show (singles not eligible)*

Class 23 Single Mini-Flora *One bloom per stem, disbudded. Single bloom defined as having only 4-8 petals*

SECTION 6 SPECIAL CHALLENGE CLASSES

Class 24 Special Challenge Class - Fragrance *Any properly-named rose, one bloom. Only one entry per exhibitor.*

Class 25 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, English-style Box: (a) One Variety (b) Combination of varieties

Class 26 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Collection *Three Blooms, One bloom per stem, disbudded. All of the same color group, displayed in separate containers.*
(a) one variety (b) combination of varieties

Class 27 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Cycle of Bloom *Three Stems, disbudded, same variety. One bud, one exhibition-stage bloom, one fully open bloom (stamens showing) in separate containers.*

Class 28 Miniature Three Sprays *Three stems displayed in separate containers*
(a) one variety (b) combination of varieties

Class 29 Miniature English Box
(a) one variety (b) combination of varieties

Class 30 Miniature Cycle of Blooms *Three stems, disbudded, of the same variety. One bud, one exhibition stage and one fully open, stamens showing, displayed in separate containers.*

Class 31 Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, or Other Large Rose in a Bowl
One bloom at exhibition stage, no foliage

Class 32 Any small Rose in a Bowl not to exceed 5" *One bloom, no foliage*

Class 33 Trailing Rose *Entry of any rose that blooms along a cane on short laterals, one stem, exhibited in an orchid tube on a cloth, lying on the table. [Exhibitor provides cloth]*

SECTION 7 JUDGES CLASS - Only open to judges who are judging the show.

Class 34 Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora or Floribunda. *One bloom per stem, disbudded*

Class 35 Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora or Floribunda. *One spray with or without sidebuds*

Class 36 Miniature or Mini-Flora. *One bloom per stem, disbudded*

Class 37 Any other Specimen - *One bloom/spray with or without sidebuds*
