DIVISION V
Rose Photography Contest

RULES:

1. The Reno Rose Show will be governed by the standard rules, regulations, and guidelines of the American Rose Society. All judging in Division I will be done according to the rules and regulations of the American Rose Society and decisions of the judges shall be final.
2. Show area will be open to entries from 7:30 to 9:30 am on June 13. Preparation area will open at 7:00 am. All entries must remain in place until 5:00 pm.
3. By entering the show, entrants give the Reno Rose Society the right to reproduce and/or keep the entrants' entries. Entrants desiring to keep their entry can provide a digital version acceptable to the Photography Chair or Show Chair in exchange for the entry.
4. Entrants are limited to one entry per class, but may enter as many classes for which they are eligible.
5. Photographs must be a minimum of 5" x 7", printed on photo-quality paper.
6. All photos must have been taken by the entrant, who must be an amateur photographer. An amateur is defined as someone who does not have a business license as a photographer.
7. The entrant may enter photographs of other people's roses or gardens.

8. Photographs which have won awards in previous contests are not eligible.
9. The rose photos will be entered under the ARS Approved Exhibition Names. Grooming the rose(s) is encouraged, and artificial backgrounds may be used.
10. Entry tags will be provided by the Reno Rose Society. Both the top and bottom of entry tags must be completely filled out. A limited number of easels will be provided by the Society.
11. Photographs may be enhanced by the use of any graphic program, such as Photoshop, Elements or Photo Impact.
12. First, second, third, and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded as warranted, but judges may withhold any at their discretion. Trophies and certificates will be awarded only to specimens meriting first place (blue) ribbons.
13. The Reno Rose Society assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to persons or property.

Judging Notes:

1. Classes 1-5 will be judged 50 percent on exhibition quality and 50 percent on photographic excellence.
2. Classes 6-7 (arrangements) will be judged 50 percent on the arrangement design and flower quality following the American Rose Society *Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements* and 50 percent on photographic excellence.
3. Classes 8-10 will be judged on photographic excellence only.

Division V

Section A Horticulture

- Class 1 One bloom, at its most perfect stage, Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda, Miniature, Mini-Flora, and their climbing counterparts, of any variety including singles, no sidebuds.
- Class 2 One spray, Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda, Miniature, Mini-Flora, or Polyantha. Two or more blooms.
- Class 3 Open bloom rose(s), stamens must show. (Singles will be disqualified.)
- Class 4 One bloom or spray of an Old Garden Rose, Shrub, or Large-Flowered Climber. Climbing hybrid teas, grandifloras, floribundas, miniatures, and mini-floras must be entered in Class 1 and 2.
- Class 5 Any rose one bloom or spray, name unknown (including unknown florists' roses).

Section B Arrangements

- Class 6 A photograph of a standard size arrangement, following the American Rose Society *Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements*. Please indicate the arranger's name if known.

Class 7 A photograph of a miniature arrangement, following the American Rose Society *Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements*. Please indicate the arranger's name if known.

Section C Artistic, Garden, Activity, and Youth Classes

Class 8 Abstract or Impressionism - A photo having non-objective design, form or content, of a rose plant(s) or any portion thereof. (Let your imagination run rampant.) This does **not** include abstract arrangements.

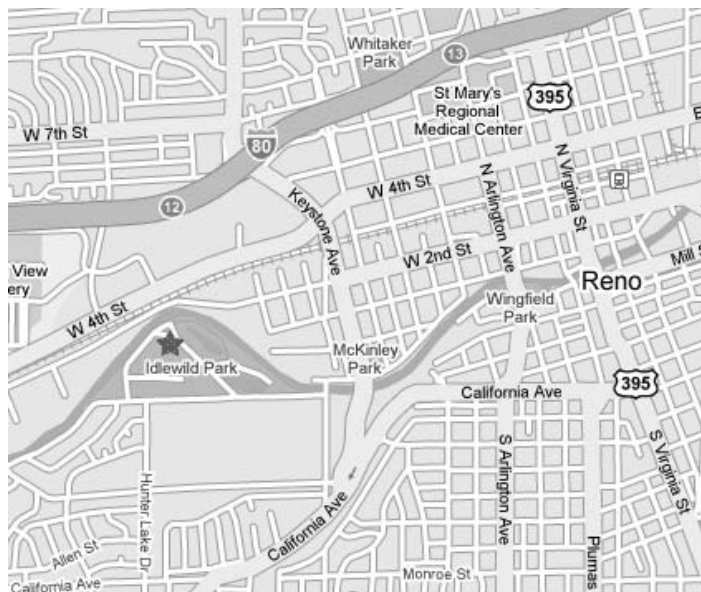
Class 9 A photograph of any rose garden OR any rose society activity. Arbors and garden ornaments permitted in the garden photograph. Indicate society and name of event in the society activity photograph.

Class 10 YOUTH CLASS: A photograph of any type of rose, rose garden or rose activity. For all entrants under the age of 16.

Directions from different parts of the area:

1. From I-80 on the west side of downtown Reno, exit at the Keystone exit and go south (downhill). Continue south on Keystone, bear right towards Booth Street, and then turn right onto Booth at the traffic light.
1. From West McCarren on the west side of the valley, go to the Mayberry intersection just south of the Truckee River and I-80. Go east on Mayberry towards downtown Reno. As you continue east, Mayberry will turn into California Avenue. Turn left onto Booth Street just after the Union 76 gas station.
3. From downtown Reno, go south on Virginia Street. Turn right onto California Avenue and then right onto Booth Street just after Keystone Blvd.
